# Rationale: (why are we doing it?)

• Using a range of materials, tools and techniques:

## Physical development:

- Developing control and co-ordination of movement/ learning about exercise:
  Weekly PE activities which will promote all the above.
  Independent activities using bikes, balls etc.
- Handling equipment and tools:

To have access to resources that support fine motor developmental skills e.g. threading activities, writing with water, using sticks, brushes to mark make. To have free access to writing materials.

To promote independent hygiene:
 To support children with their personal hygiene.

# Communication and Language:

- Listen attentively:
  Listen and communicate with the children at all times during the day, promoting and responding to conversations using expressive language.
- Children to follow instructions

## Personal, Social and Emotional development:

• To build the children's confidence and to promote a positive relationship between children and adults.

## Alongside the children's interests that come from the topic:

- Enrich children's vocabulary of colour, e.g., lemon, crimson, scarlet, ruby, jade and emerald.
- Shop green grocers, farm shop
